Mayor William Isley called the regular meeting to order and gave the invocation. David Jones led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of October 3 Regular Meeting

David Jones made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 3 regular meeting. Wayne Tucker seconded the motion. All voted aye.

September 2016 Budget Report

Chip Martin made a motion to approve the September 2016 budget report. Hugh Marlin seconded the motion. All voted aye.

Laura Cheney-Springville Library Foundation

Springville Library Foundation President Laura Cheney thanked the council for their work to renovate the old city hall for the children's library annex and community improvements that have been made by the expansion of library services.

Bruce Smith – Water Rates

Bruce Smith addressed the council regarding the need for minimum billing on water accounts and repair issues. Mayor William Isley explained the need for minimum billing to provide access to water service and the benefits of the city's participation in the Coosa Valley Water Authority related to water availability and restrictions on use during drought conditions. James Hill discussed the rate structure as it relates to infrastructure and future improvements. Earl Peoples discussed the procedure for prioritizing repairs to water mains with minimal interruption of service.

Mayor's Report

Mayor William Isley discussed a drug take-back at Walmart on October 22, a planned 5K Run, Treats on Main on October 28 from 3pm-5pm, and thanked the Library Board for funding assistance for the new library furnishings.

Richard Harvey reminded everyone about the No Burn Order for the area.

Herbert Toles said that he has received complaints about dead trees on the right-of-way on several streets. Mayor William Isley said that an effort would be made to identify dangerous trees throughout the city and obtain prices for their removal.

Herbert Toles said that he has received complaints about the ditch and road conditions at the Post Office entrance. Mayor William Isley asked Earl Peoples to prepare a projected cost for road and ditch improvements at that intersection.

With no further business to come before the council, David Jones made a motion to adjourn. Wayne Tucker seconded the motion. All voted aye.
