Amendments to Agenda

Herbert Toles made a motion to amend the agenda to include a discussion of the MacDonald Farms Subdivision by Hugh Marlin, business license enforcement by John Coyne, and Clean Up Day by Herbert Toles. David Jones seconded the motion. All voted aye.

Minutes of February 6, 2012 Regular Meeting

David Jones made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 6, 2012 regular council meeting. John Coyne seconded the motion. All voted aye.

January 2012 Budget Report

Hugh Marlin made a motion to approve the January 2012 budget report. Wayne Tucker seconded the motion. All voted aye.

Clean Up Day

Herbert Toles said that he had scheduled Clean Up Day for Saturday, April 7 at 8:00 a.m. with dumpsters to be located at the entrance to Big Springs Park.

John Coyne-Business License Enforcement

John Coyne raised concerns over individuals/entities doing business in the City without a license and asked about enforcement procedures including stopping the work from continuing. Building Official Richard Harvey explained the process in place for enforcement of the business license ordinance including the availability of recourse through the municipal court. After discussion, Mayor William Isley asked that John Coyne, Richard Harvey, and James Hill meet and consider necessary revisions to the ordinance.

Hugh Marlin-MacDonald Farms Subdivision

Hugh Marlin discussed the condition of the streets in Phase 2 of MacDonald Farms Subdivision and measures that could be taken by the city to require the developer to complete the street paving requirements. James Hill said that he has scheduled a meeting with the developer to discuss the paving issues and recourse available to the city and will report on the progress at the next meeting.

Richard Harvey-SAFER Grant

Richard Harvey said that he had received notification that the outstanding SAFER grant funds would be paid by the end of the week and expressed his appreciation for the work done by Congressman Bacchus and his staff to resolve the problem with the funds.
