CITY COUNCIL
WORK SESSION
May 4, 2018 8:00 a.m.**

The City Council of the City of Springville (the “Council”) held a work session at 8:00 a.m. on May 4, 2018. The purpose of the work session was to discuss the agenda items and potential agenda items.

ROLL CALL:

Mayor William Isley asked Mayor Pro Tempore to conduct the meeting due to his recent eye surgery.

Mayor Pro Tempore Wayne Tucker presented certificates of completion for the CAPZO program to Tim Walker and Allen Crawford.

Jamie Twente introduced Library Board members Sandra Tucker, Sally Goolsby, Geneva Smith, Carol Mills, and Tabitha Hanner and Library employees Sarah Reese, Ann Sargent, Linda Williams, and Vicky Stone. Jamie discussed plans for the Summer Reading Program and other activities at the library.

The council discussed Ordinance 2018-06 to amend the zoning ordinance to rezone property located on Highway 11 from R2 Multi Family Residential to B2 General Business District.

The council discussed Ordinance 2018-07 to annex the Wright Farm property. After discussion regarding traffic concerns, the APPLE grant results, volume of housing, and zoning, the council asked James Hill to provide plans for a Planned Use Development for the property before the annexation is considered.

The council discussed Ordinance 2018-08 to amend Ordinance 2018-04 to increase the recreation board to 9 members and appointment of members to the recreation board.

The council discussed Resolution 2018-13 to adopt the Municipal Water Pollution Prevention program.

The council discussed funding options and plans for renovation of the baseball park, purchase of property for parking, and further development at the sports park.

Chief Belinda Crapet presented information regarding the county inmate work program for cleaning up litter.

James Hill discussed the Forever Wild closing, an agreement with the Chamber of Commerce, and a grant for soccer field lighting.

The council discussed a request from the DAR for placement of a historical marker.

With no further business to come before the council, the work session was adjourned.
